### John Doe Testimony

MOA respects brawlers; the guys who are used to tasting their own blood and have scars to talk about. That's how I got in.

I was known on the streets of New York and that's how I came across the guys from MOA and <u>786 Security</u>, the group run by Hussain Abdallah, or "K-1" as MOA calls him. 786 Security was his business but it's part of the group. When you're a member, anything you do, whatever business you own, serves Gilani and the group.

### MOA Leadership

Abdallah's got the most respect of Gilani's leaders in America. Hussein Adams is the guy who goes in front of the cameras. He's known as "K-2." They have those ranks for a reason. Adams looks like MOA's leader beneath Gilani but Abdallah has been the man from the beginning. He's closer to Sheikh Gilani and he brought him here from Pakistan.

There's also the Council of Khalifas. Each camp has two khalifas and these khalifas make the decisions, but they'd never go against something Gilani said. If Gilani says something, that's it. That's the word. Hussein Adams doesn't call the shots.

If someone's a Khalifa, you know they did something big, like killing someone. Khalifas have proven themselves. Barry Adams didn't have the title of Khalifa until he went to prison because of the big bomb plot he was part of in Toronto in 1991. You gotta pay a price for that title.

Each camp or commune or "land" as they call it has two khalifas.

A lot of people don't like Hussein Adams and say he shouldn't even be a Khalifa; that he just got it because of his daddy. He's out there looking like he's number one and acts like he's number one, but so many other people were in the jamaat longer. They feel like he lacks respect for the elders and favors the young ones who think he's cool.

Hussein Adams arrogant. He's very arrogant, very, very, arrogant. He's stubborn. He thinks he's the shit. Hussain Abdallah and him don't get along because of it. Hell, Adams even wanted Gilani to kick Abdallah off the land at one point. Didn't happen.

Gilani's really sick and everyone knows he'll drop any second. One of his sons will take over but there's going to be a lot of doubt. Everybody's positioning themselves for Gilani's death.

There's going to be a war, a political war, maybe a shooting war, when he dies. Whoever replaces him is going to have to do something or the group's going to start splitting and I have no idea what's going to happen then. Really, anything can happen with these guys.

#### A Fanatical Cult

The first thing you've got to understand is that these guys are a cult and they are terrorists and they are a gang. They are a threat to America no matter what bullshit they give you. Almost everyone has 100% loyalty to Gilani, but a lot of people are getting tired of the tight rules and regulations. You've got to follow Gilani's law, his Islamic law, and it's to keep you from becoming Americanized as much as possible. To this day, they have the same pledge as from the beginning, to "hear and obey" all commands.

The papers today don't mention Gilani. No paperwork like that would ever mention Gilani today. But they still pledge their allegiance, called bayat in Islam, to him, but it rises to a level that equals their pledge to God.

Anyone who disrespects their Sheikh—MOA wants to get them, but Gilani doesn't want too much exposure. Guys like you (Mawyer/Mauro) have got to keep public because that's what's saving you.

The two guys they want to kill most are Ali Abdel-Aziz, the MOA member who was an informant of the NYPD, and Martin Mawyer. I know they were looking for Ali Abdel-Aziz at one point. I've heard them talking about possibly killing Martin for his film and then his documentary about MOA but I assume there wasn't a green light from Gilani because, if there was, you [Mawyer] wouldn't be here.

If something were to happen to you [Mawyer] right now, it'd bring the heat back on them. But, really, watch yourself. I'm not saying something's going to happen next month. I'm not saying something's going to happen next year. But once MOA feels like they've turned things around and gotten accomplished what they want done, they're coming for you. And they'll shoot the shit out of you. They don't want to torture you. They'd like to see you dead. Quick, make sure you're gone.

But for something like that, they'd need the Sheikh's approval. It's a bigger deal than going after their enemies on the streets. But if they saw you right there, I don't know what they'd do. They might just see the opportunity and take action. Even without Gilani's approval, there are certain lines that'll make them snap at you guys.

You all [Mawyer/Mauro] are about to do some big stuff that's going to really expose the group. And different things could happen. The sheikh might say to get you. Some of the MOA may just assume retaliation is justifiable and do it, or they might get so mad they disregard the sheikh and do it. A lot of them think Gilani talks to them in dreams and visions. Maybe a member has a dream where he's told to respond, or just lies and says he had a dream.

I haven't heard them talk about going after anyone like they have about Martin. There was some talk about a New York congressman that they thought was coming after Muslims and a young Pakistani woman who is a report and they think she bashes all Muslims.

# A Terrorist Ideology

They are part of the jihad, as they see it. Everything they do is in some way part of this war. They actually do love Obama, though. They think he's from the lineage of the Prophet Muhammad, peace and blessings be upon him, just like they think that about Sheikh Gilani. He's part of the family in their minds. Gilani even instructed us to vote for him.

MOA thinks Obama's responsible for the heat coming off them and the government, the police, are backing off because he protects Muslims. The drone strikes and attacks on Muslims—they think he doesn't control that; that's done by the New World Order, the Zionists. Obama's only one person and doesn't really control much, especially the military; that's how they see Obama and his power.

They think you can be pro-Obama or pro-America but still fight against America because America is controlled by this New World Order that's trying to destroy Islam. They teach that America is oppressing Muslims here and overseas, so be prepared for a fight at any moment. Overseas, they say America is raping and killing Muslim women and kids and the only thing that'll save these innocent Muslims is an eye-for-an-eye, tooth-for-a-tooth. And every Muslim is required to defend any Muslim under attack anywhere.

They'd say they aren't anti-American because they don't hate all Americans. They want to make America better by fighting the Americans who are part of the Zionist New World Order—the media, the government, the police, the Jews, and anyone who supports them. You guys [Mawyer & Mauro] are a big part of that conspiracy.

MOA is really big on the End Times and Muslims in general will read Christian prophecies, too. In MOA, most think that the U.S. is the Beast; China is the Dragon; Russia is the Bear and the U.K. is the lion. Some think that Israel is the lion. America is also the eagle.

Gilani tells MOA they are so important because they "are in the land of the beast."

MOA also hates gays and believes they should all be executed in an Islamic State with Sharia Law. If they think a member is gay, they'll punish him because they think they can beat the gay out of him and put him through this Islamic therapy invented by Gilani. It's a disease caused by invisible demonic beings called "Jinns."

I know that at least some of them privately celebrated the terrorist attack in Orlando because the target was gays.

They see it as part of the Islamic verse, "slay them wherever you find them." They see it as God's judgement so the gays basically killed themselves by doing what they're doing.

# 786 Security

Everyone that talks about Fuqra or MOA or Gilani talks about the camps. They're missing where a lot of the action is. They're not going to do the nastiest stuff on the camps and incriminate everyone there.

Hussain Abdallah, "K-1," isn't someone to fuck with. People say that he thinks he's going to die as a martyr. Gilani told him he had a vision of him dying in a hail of bullets.

He's the guy who I said went to Pakistan and then brought Gilani over and he started meeting people in the Dar ul-Islam movement. Members of Dar ul-Islam started pledging their loyalty to Gilani and it caused a big fight in the movement where people were getting shot. That's how MOA started.

In those early days, things were really rough for Muslims and blacks, with gangs and stuff. The Muslims at Masjid Yasin, where MOA was, were known as warriors. If Masjid Taqwa had a problem with its members getting harassed or something, they'd call Masjid Yasin. 25 or 30 guys would show up and whoop some ass if they had to. Other times they just escorted people to scare anyone off from mugging them.

If Masjid Farooq had a problem, they'd call Masjid Yasin.
Masjid Farooq is where the Blind Shiekh from the World
Trade Center bombing was. The different mosques' members
were friendly and would help each other out.

Compared to the drug dealers and gang members, these Muslim fighters were good guys, like a neighborhood watch.

Some of that still goes on. There's been times where one of our ladies' headscarves was snatched off or one of our brothers was robbed and we retaliate for that. I know of one guy who robbed one of our own and our guys handcuffed him in a garage and fucked him up; handcuffed him in a garage and then didn't let him go until the next day. The people talking about it said he was a mess with swollen eyes and they think his jaw was broken.

Some of the brawlers were involved with Hussain Abdallah's 786 Security company. Not all 786 guys are MOA though. Abdallah also had a second section, 786 Parking. They'd be hired by management companies to clean up a spot, like telling drug addicts and dealers they had to leave the area. If they didn't, they'd beat the shit out of them. After the spot was cleaned up, another team would come in and maintain it

A lot of the 786 guys and MOA were recruited from the prisons. The father of one of the top guys was a prison chaplain. There's one imam who recruited from different jails and then was fired.

Prisoners are seen as the oppressed and as the best warriors. And groups like MOA give them the discipline and structure after they leave. Prisoners are tough. They can fight. They know how to make their own weapons. They follow prison law. They know "snitches get stitches."

786 Security had a lot of weapons; bought and sold them. Some personnel sold drugs. The company transferred money to Islamberg for Gilani.

This one time there was this big brawl with the NYPD in 2003. The guys involved are legends for that. We always heard the 79<sup>th</sup> Precinct officers were these tough guys and they got their asses whooped. One of the 786 guys is a black belt and he threw those cops around, broke their bones, like it was nothing.

Man, people in the group still talk about that. They kept retelling the story; thought it was hilarious how crazy it got. It started with three MOA fighters when the NYPD was following them around. NYPD had to send in backup and more MOA and 786 guys came. Only some of the 786 guys got detained because most got away. They said it was chaos. And after they got locked up, this politician, Annette Robinson, knew them so she raised hell and got them released. I think 786 did work for her or something like that.

It's amazing how 786 and MOA got away with stuff. There was this raid and only one 786 office was searched. The stockpile of guns was in Restoration Plaza, safe and sound. Only a few guys ever got arrested.

After 786 Security shut down because of raids by the IRS, DEA and ATF, 786 Parking continued. They made real money by people paying to park there, but it was the perfect meeting spot for gun and drug transfers or just hanging out.

Both parts of 786 are gone now but MOA still uses security companies. The same old thing is going on. The people involved are still around in the same area; some acting as sleepers, in New York City, in the Bronx, in Brooklyn.

Waging Jihad

MOA is most definitely a terrorist organization; most definitely. It's just like they are in hibernation. Sheikh Gilani is still their leader and he knew about every terrorist attack they did.

It was Gilani who gave word for that imam from the Ahmadiyya (the Qadianis) to be killed in Michigan by MOA two days before it happened. As an organization, they were named MOA but they called themselves Jamaat Al-Fuqra then.

Just like then, they said they opposed terrorism and wouldn't ever do things like what they did to that imam in Michigan, but it's not what it sounds like. When Gilani and the MOA leaders would say things like "you aren't allowed to kill nobody," it always meant that you couldn't kill without proper religious authority. That religious authority was Gilani. It means there's no blanket approval right now—you can't just go and do it—but you can get approval or ordered in specific circumstances.

MOA stopped directly engaging in terrorist attacks after the early 1990s because Sheikh Gilani didn't want to lose his cash cow. But who knows what's going on in Pakistan; it's assumed they are helping terrorists—they call them mujahideen—from there.

No one I've talked to seems to really know what Gilani is up to. It's real mysterious. Even MOA's medical team that goes to Pakistan won't always see him if he's up in the mountains when they are visiting.

The camp in Colorado was raided in 1992 and they knew they had to back off after the World Trade Center bombing in 1993.

But they still believe they are required to help Muslims defend every Muslim who is oppressed, so I think they just switched to helping other terrorist groups.

That's what I think happened with the World Trade Center bombing. Blind Sheikh and MOA were brothers and it's known within MOA that our group knew the bombers beforehand. I've heard about how one guy involved came from overseas—maybe it was Blind Sheikh they were referring to—and briefly stayed with us shortly before the bombing.

The lands are like terrorist shuttlebuses. There's been many times where Gilani has told the camps to be ready to welcome a visitor, sometimes praising him as someone pursuing martyrdom, and MOA won't be told who he is. The visitor shows up for prayers and lodging and then is on his way somewhere.

Same sort of thing might have happened with the snipers in Washington DC. One of them had something to do with the jamaat in Virginia but that's kept real hush-hush; on a need-to-know basis.

One thing I've noticed are international phone calls that I don't hear talked about. Phone numbers in Egypt, in Iran, etc. I've been with MOA elders where it's been said that money is going to these jihad groups fighting over there.

But Gilani and his guys are up to something there because the Pakistani government is scared of MOA. The Pakistani government keeps blocking people from the medical volunteer team from going and some people got stuck there when Pakistan confiscated their passport. MOA does actually do humanitarian work but it's assumed by everyone in MOA that there's other covert stuff happening, too. Not all of MOA's trips to Pakistan are for terrorism, though. I know of one guy who went to Pakistan to learn Arabic. He didn't know a word so they put him in a classroom with kids, it was like 1<sup>st</sup> grade. It was hilarious because he complained that the kids picked on him and he had a small desk.

Gilani directly tells MOA that the money that goes to him goes for jihad in Kashmir and other places where Muslims are under attack. We don't have fighting units so it's understood that it goes to other groups who are doing the jihad.

That's what happened with Daniel Pearl, I think. He probably gave his information to others so his hands could be clean. Deep inside, I know he killed that young man. I don't think the MOA in America had anything to do with it, though.

MOA is still violent, but it's on the streets against people who pick a fight, like drug dealers. Robbing drug dealers has been part of what MOA does ever since the start. It's possible that MOA is doing small acts of terrorism like assassinations and no one knows it's MOA. The group never took credit for anything, ever. If they can make it look like a drug murder, or that someone else did it, or help someone else do it, then that's what they'll do.

There's definitely been talk about killing cops and not just those that might raid the villages. There's some guys who'd love to kill cops. I don't know of anyone who actually has. They won't actually plan to do something like that unless they hear that Gilani approved of it.

But here's the thing; here's where the authorities are fucking up.

They target terrorists one-by-one, like each group is a separate thing. Like, they think, "OK, this group is too much so we go after these terrorists but not these terrorists." The terrorists don't see themselves like that.

Once you're labeled an Islamic terrorist, you're part of a family. It's like they are their own ummah (global community of Muslims) even if most Muslims aren't with them. The terrorist groups work together like a family; the line between them gets blurry.

# Guerilla Training

That military-style training is still going on at these retreats they hold. Sometimes the event takes place at Islamberg or another land and then those that get the real training go somewhere else. The more sensitive training happens off the land.

The training includes handling guns, combat tactics, how to physically fight, archery, mountain climbing bomb-making for some. Some were trained on how to make a bomb using a light-bulb and how to trigger a bomb by calling a phone. I don't know of those types of bombings ever being used, though. I think the lightbulb bomb was going to be used against a religious leader a long time ago they didn't like in the Detroit area but wasn't for some reason.

Members have to pay to go to these retreats and that money goes to Gilani when the top women go to Pakistan. Every retreat is just a cover for this kind of stuff. Even kids learn how to use guns. The retreats end with Gilani addressing the group from Pakistan where he brags about the group and tells them how they are all good Muslims. And they just fawn over him.

In general, MOA is staying away from wearing that military green fatigue when they train. You fucked that up for them when you [Mauro/Clarion Project] released that video of the women training in Islamberg.

They were pissed at you for that. They were all talking about it. I remember them saying "that mother fucker needs to mind his own business" but didn't mention you by name when I heard it. They are dangerous but I didn't hear them talk about killing you.

What you saw there was the women's retreat, which is held separately from the men's, but there's male instructors for the training. Part of the reason the women are trained like that is because the men work outside the camps, so the women are the defensive force if the camps come under attack.

They say that all of this is "defensive" training, but they are taught that they are definitely going to have to use those skills. That war is coming. And they all know that you counter-attack, you go on the offensive, when there's war. So even if they say it's "self-defense," it's still definitely a threat to America because of what they believe they are supposed to fight, who is going to attack them, who they'll end up at war with.

If you are born on the land, you have to get this training at some point. They actually videotape it and send it to Gilani because he wants to see that it's happening and they show their devotion to him.

There are also martial arts instructors who teach members whenever they want. I know of at least two at Islamberg. Most, if not all, of the homes at Islamberg have guns inside. But the guns aren't just inside the homes. It's a huge place. I've seen machine guns, grenades, some things that looked like mortar tubes; shit that'll do damage to everyone in the area.

Everyone at MOA expects the group is going to have to fight one day. Always be ready. This fight is always on our minds. Eventually there will be a jihad inside America, but the talk right now is that Gilani said MOA has to be ready because the members might have to go fight other terrorists attacking Sufis and their shrines in Pakistan and Iraq, like ISIS.

### Soldiers of Allah

The Soldiers of Allah, those fighters that Gilani talked about in that old tape, they are still around.

There's two groups. There's the Muslim Rangers; the same thing as the Muslim Boy Scouts they have. They handle smaller things. Might beat someone up.

The Soldiers of Allah would be like they hit team, the Navy Seals of MOA. Some of them live on the camps and some live off, so don't forget about these guys outside the camps. They are all trained in Tai-chi and other martial arts.

The SOA wear all-black clothes like ninjas when they train because they see themselves as fighting at night. You'll see them wearing tan uniforms when they performing a service for MOA like providing security for an event or when there's something going on nearby where they feel heat. They'll be in hiding spots like up in trees.

That's why these protests or unexpected visitors to the lands are so dangerous. They truly think they are always one second away from being attacked. And the SOAs are there in place to respond at the slightest hint that something's about to go down. They'll think something like a protest is going to be used as a cover to attack them and they'll get ready for it.

I can think of five SOA guys at Islamberg; five at Red House, Virginia; about 10 at the Dover, Tennessee land; 15 in South Carolina, that are SOAs. I don't know any in Georgia but I'm sure they are there. They are the ones who will shoot if they see a threat to the camp.

The SOA don't care about this life. Everything you do in this life is to prepare you for the afterlife and Gilani is their guide. They don't live on the camps and are dormant. I call them sleepers because they are ready to do anything at any moment. They are happy to get locked up, too. That's a badge of honor.

These are some of the same guys that might do a retaliation or something really sensitive. If the New York land has an issue to take care of, someone from the Virginia land will do it. It's an old drug dealer trick. You don't want someone in the area of the act to be responsible; it makes it too easy to get caught.

Another thing—regular MOA members don't know what's going on except for what happens to them personally. There's a lot of secrecy and the members accept that. They understand that they can't be told certain things and shouldn't even ask about a lot of stuff. So there might be a SOA doing something and his own family might not even know what he's up to.

#### Crime

A ton of money comes from drugs. Sheikh Gilani and MOA preach against drugs, but that's why the sellers usually don't do it. You don't get high on your own supply. None of the guys I came across manufactured drugs themselves.

I know that Gilani and the leaders say they kicked all the criminals out of the camps. That's a lie. The camps would have barely anyone in it if that was true. The people who are still doing crimes are mostly living outside of the camps, but they come in all the time.

No one ever said this to me directly but, to me, you can tell what's going on. The people doing crime right now are off the camps because they don't want incidents repeatedly being linked back to the addresses of the camps. And they don't want to have to give access to parole officers. That's why the criminals, like the drug and gun traffickers, are in Binghamton, Johnson City and New York City.

The gun trafficking that I knew about involved AR-15s and a whole lot of ammunition. MOA buys guns for themselves but they also sell them for cash. A lot are coming into New York from the south, like the Carolinas. I don't know if they came from somewhere else first.

You've got to realize these aren't normal criminals. They come from a long line of criminals; this knowledge is passed on. They study the law. They know how far to stay away from any illegal guns so they can't be arrested for possession. They generally know where those kinds of lines are.

Example – the money laundering. These know how to funnel money because the top guys have been doing it since the Dar ul-Islam days. MOA has accountants who know how to wire and reroute money overseas.

The "Land Boys" is a drug gang of MOA members. They are willing to rob—kill if they got to—other gang members and drug dealers. They and other drug dealers get the revenue, spend a lot on themselves so they can show off, and some of the money is collected by one guy who goes up to the land at Islamberg. The mayor takes it and then, eventually, one of the ladies brings it to Pakistan for Gilani.

Jammat al-Fuqra means "community of the impoverished" but the MOA drug dealers aren't impoverished. They flash their money around. They have a lot of business in Binghamton and Johnson City. They like to be known on the streets.

MOA also has bounty hunters; I think five of them. They make money by arresting the wanted people in different states but they make even more by taking the skipper's drugs. Bounty hunters can enter the missing person's home, so they go in and take their money and drugs. The young guys resell the drugs.

It doesn't matter if the transfers of money to Gilani are in small amounts. There can be many small amounts. Plus our dollars are worth way more in Pakistan.

### Life Inside MOA

The camps I've been to are Islamberg in New York, Red House in Virginia, Islamville in South Carolina and the one in Tennessee. I've never been to the one in Michigan. You don't hear much about it. I never heard a reason for people to go there. I don't know what the deal is with that.

People are leaving the Tennessee land and that's been a problem for MOA. They had a land in Florida but I don't know if it's still there after its main Khalifa died.

I know they still have jamaats—MOA communities—in Philadelphia and Detroit. There's one in Alaska that most people didn't even know about for a long time. A jamaat can be a camp or it can be separate from a camp. Some are on only a need-to-know basis. I've heard different numbers about how many jamaats there are. Some come and go, so the number changes. I've heard the numbers 22 or 23 the most often, but I've also heard 15 and 27.

There's a Dawah center, like a mosque, outside each land and people that don't live on the land go to them. It might not be in anything you'd notice. A mosque can just be a house or part of a building they picked.

They have a new jamaat in Mexico that they are really excited about. There's a Hispanic khalifa we nicknamed "Julio" because he goes there and they love him there. They're picking up more and more people there. Right now they are raising money to buy land between Hancock and Binghamton, right near Islamberg.

By the way, MOA members live outside Islamberg in Binghamton along the streets you turn onto to go there. That's how they always know when people are coming. They're always watching and reporting back. That's why they are usually waiting for you at the front when it looks like no one is around.

Abu Bakr is the Khalifa of the jamaat land in Trinidad. I've heard that he's above the rest of the khalifas. He was involved in killing an imam from the Ahmadiyya sect in Michigan; an attack on a mosque [a likely reference to the killing of a Muslim cleric in Arizona in 1990) and the 1991 bomb plot in Canada.

There's also a murderer of Americans in Trinidad, where he got locked up. MOA members donated money for his legal defense and they dispatched an attorney to win his release from the prison in Trinidad. One time they were trying to get a land in Pennsylvania and they raised this money for it but the land ended up not being good for living. Everybody was required to donate to it and no one saw any of it returned to them when it wasn't bought. You hear a lot of stories like that, like when they fundraise for trips. A lot of families suffered during the jihad in Afghanistan because people donated to those that went there and they weren't allowed into Afghanistan. A lot of women were upset because they were left with nothing and people who donated never got anything back.

Members are required to pay 10% of all income to the group and a lot of that goes to Pakistan. Average members don't know what's done with it after it is collected. If you live on the camps and don't pay, you're threatened with expulsion.

A lot of this money comes from fraud. You've got to realize that when they talk about following the law, they aren't talking about your law. They are talking about Islamic law. Yeah, they respect American law to the point that Islamic law—or I should say Gilani Law—lets them.

So, case in point, women often claim not to know the father of their children. They get all this government assistance. It's not stealing because they see it as recouping money stolen from them. The men have jobs or do crime and live off the women's food stamps. Probably every single woman is on welfare and gets food stamps.

And they have a ton of kids. I don't know if the state even knows about all of them. Polygamy is very common and many of the them don't get marriage certificates. They just do an Islamic marriage and that's it.

I know of one store where they'd get paid in cash for their food stamps. They are happy—they got like 80% of it in cash that they didn't have before—the store is happy because they got 20% more than they would have. This money lets the leaders live like kings over their subjects. They are the first to get their homes renovated. It reminds every one of their place. It's just like the rich drug lords who take the crackheads' money and let them rot away.

Islamberg has really bad conditions. It's really unsanitary. I couldn't believe it at first. There's no bathrooms when you go there except the lake. And then you see people drinking and cooking from the same water.

A lot of the women in the group are recruited through romance. They fall for a guy in MOA. The women who have been in MOA a long time dislike the new women who come around who aren't MOA yet or just joined. They act like they better. It's not a race thing. The white women who marry into the group are the same way.

Gilani bans Muslims from going to public school. Islamberg and the other lands have homeschools on their land and that's where the kids usually go. Some members send their kids to public school anyway. I know of some people who were kicked off the land for having their kids in public school but they can still be members of the jamaat. A lot of kids are going to college but, even there, it's for skills that'll ultimately benefit MOA.

There's midwives on the land because the women are told to give birth there instead of the hospital. They really pressure the women not to go to hospitals because of they think it's wrong for a non-Muslim or male doctor to see their bodies. Breast cancer is very common.

### Sharia Law

On the land, the rules are real strict. Gilani says they are to live by Sharia as much as they can and don't involve outsiders. If one person commits a crime against another, you don't call the cops. They have an internal police and Sharia justice system for that. The judges are called Qadis and they order things like lashings. Hasib Haqq was a Qadi for a long time.

Sometimes the Islamic judges settle the disputes and sometimes they punish you for your sins. They lash you. They've got this spot in Islamberg that they call "the hole." It's like an underground coffin with a metal sheet covering it. Air comes in but you're in complete darkness but they'll give you just bread and water each day. People will be in there for 30 days; I've heard of 45 day sentences.

For lesser sins, they'll tie you to a tree and lash you. I've known of guys who got beat, too, hit with bleach-soaked belts or two-by-fours.

These punishments go on all the time. They aren't rare. There's a fucking waiting list to be put in "the hole." I've heard of people waiting like a year. Some people don't ever recover. They lose their minds being in there. One guy who bugged out is in prison now on weapons charges. His own dad approved of punishing him that way.

Smoking is completely banned. They eventually banned TVs from being in the homes on the lands because of people getting caught watching porn and one woman cheated on her husband with someone and they had watched porn. The security team on the land will break into your home if they find out you've got a TV and they'll smash it. If you're caught, you get 30 lashes and you're kicked off the land. One woman questioned MOA rules because she knew Islam before joining the group. These guys usually converted into Islam with MOA so they don't see how they violate the Koran, but she knew. They kicked her out in the middle of the night. Didn't even give her time to prepare and they wouldn't even let the cab come onto the land to get her, so she had to walk with all her stuff and figure out what to do from there.

# "They're Rocking the Christians to Sleep, Just Like Babies"

MOA formed this partnership with Christians called the United Muslim Christian Forum. They think they won't be spied on if they are with Christians and that they won't be followed when they are using this name. They feel that it's worked really well for their image and getting the government off their back.

It's amazing. They're rocking the Christians to sleep, they're rocking them to sleep, just like you'd rock a baby to sleep. They are even getting the Christians to speak on their behalf. I can't believe it. It's so easy that you can't blame them for thinking the heat is coming off them and they are going to be in the clear soon.

This work with Christians is always what they talk about when they talk to the authorities, especially after it was found out that Ali Abdel-Aziz was a NYPD informant when he gave that interview to you [Mawyer].

### Dealing with Law Enforcement

The stories I heard were that MOA confronted the authorities after the news about Ali Abdel-Aziz came out. MOA bragged how they were doing this Christian outreach with and telling them how betrayed they felt. The police told them they'd start backing off; that they were extra cautious about Muslims because of 9/11 but now they are backing off MOA.

As for Ali, NYPD shouldn't think they have a good idea of everything that's happening because of him or whatever other informants they might have. MOA operates with the assumption that there's a snitch around.

Ali exaggerated his importance. He wasn't a bodyguard for anyone, ever. The stuff he said about MOA is true but anything about him being this big shot, that's shit. He was an arrogant son of a bitch. No one liked him. He walked around like he owned the place. Didn't listen to no one. They considered him a good brother but he was young and he wasn't there long enough to be at the top. The father of the girl he married at Islamberg wants to kill him. To this day, I believe he'd kill him if he had the chance.

Gilani kicked Ali out of the jamaat because he had a dog and it's against Islam to have a dog as a pet. You can only have them as guards or some kind of purpose like that. He chose his dog over the jamaat so he was gone. Then he came to you [Mawyer]. MOA has also always had people on the inside. I've heard of at least two MOA members getting hired by police departments. Last I heard, a khalifa's son was a deputy sheriff. They've had corrections officers in Virginia. One member works in a sheriff's office down south.

MOA is tricking police, but all this stuff about "we're cooperating with the police" is bullshit. It wasn't that long ago that New York State Police arrested a robber living on the land [Islamberg]. They had to go through the elders and then Hussein Adams handed him over, outside of the land, because they told the police they couldn't come onto the land.

But they make it sound like they so transparent, so open. Watch what happens if you just try to enter without a scheduled time. They'll stop you by force. A Solider of Allah might even shoot you. They'll tell you to make an appointment by phone. They won't pick up or call you back or if they do, they'll make sure they have enough time to move their stashes and prepare everything.

They are blinding people. Those American flags you see in pictures when the police visit, they aren't always there. They went up right before they arrived at the agreed upon day. Goes down right after they leave. And a lot of the kids are moved off the land or are all the way in the back where the picnics aren't held so they look so small and the police don't know about all these kids out there.

They all know that pledging allegiance to the flag of a country is considered shirk in Islam, because you can only have allegiance to Allah. You can't share that allegiance with a country of men, a government run by men like they are the authority.

When you see them talking about how they fought in Vietnam, that doesn't mean jack shit because that was when they were non-Muslim. That doesn't represent them now. I bet some of those guys in military uniforms didn't even serve and just bought the uniforms from an army or navy store or something.

New York police, it's like they don't give a shit. That's what I'm really starting to think. There's enough out there, on the Internet, they have to have some idea that it's a bad, really bad situation. They've locked up enough people who are part of MOA or work with MOA to get informants if they tried, but nothing ever changes.

I know from the Ali situation they cared at least somewhat in the past. Now it's like none of the authorities give a fuck. It doesn't seem like they do. Maybe they are cocky and think they know it all and got it all under control. But so much goes on, nothing happens. And something could. MOA knows it, so they are just waiting for the day they are removed off any kind of terror watch lists.

Probably part of it is the police being afraid of looking like they are persecuting religious minorities. Maybe it's because they claim to be Muslim, and they're black, and they can cause a ruckus, that they are let go. If this was a non-Muslim MOA, it'd be shut down. I'm a Muslim saying that. It's one of the only things I can think of.

At the least, the government should be removing all the kids from these lands. It's abuse having them there. It's robbing them of their future. MOA threatens their mental health right from the start. These kids, man, even these drug dealers—they are bad but they start as kids there and that's it for them.

And it's like no one even tries to go in there and see what's happening to them.

# MOA: Getting Stronger

Gilani is sick and there's all these problems; these factions that don't like each other, but it looks to me like they are growing. They have sometimes dozens of kids and new people still join. That's why they say they need to buy more land right now.

And like I said before, MOA thinks the heat is coming off of them. It's dangerous to have them think of that. Gilani is said to leave Pakistan sometimes now. They said he's no longer banned from international travel and MOA members are coming off of the U.S. government's no-fly list.

I don't know of any terrorist plots or anything like that going on right now, but it's what they believe in. Their jihad will come once they think they are off the hook, as they think they have more freedom to operate. Only reason they aren't into it now is because the heat of the media, from guys like you, is still on them. Only reason. You've got to keep the heat on them like you are.

# Why I'm Speaking

Gilani doesn't preach Islam. He and MOA violate Islam all over the place. Actually, if you really study Islam—these invisible Satanic jinn beings that MOA always talks about—he fits the description. He's the jinn being giving Islam a bad name.

Gilani claims he is a shapeshifter and can appear on the lands in the form of an animal. He can be in multiple spots at once.

MOA teaches he has the power to defeat and control a jinn being. In Islam, only a jinn being can do these things.

In Islam, we have sins that are called shirk. It includes putting someone on the level of Allah, God. Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, isn't Allah. He's the Last Messenger of Allah. But MOA treats Gilani just like Allah. They act as if he has the power of Allah.

Case in point. Gilani has to approve for you to go on the hajj to Mecca. Probably 95 percent of MOA has never made the hajj and that's a pillar of Islam. That's a requirement and that's between you and God and no one else. So Gilani gets to control whether you keep a pillar of Islam that's required for you to go to paradise. That's shirk. That's 100% shirk. Muslims believe that angels will question us about our actions after we die and we are judged. MOA believes Gilani will answer on your behalf. Again, he's coming between you and Allah. That's shirk, completely.

Gilani has said the moon followed his finger in the sky during one of his miracles. That's a sign of prophethood. The first thing about Islam is that the Prophet Muhammad, may peace be upon him, is the Last Messenger. No more after that. Shirk again.

Here's another thing. He's always condemning the Saudis who will never do anything with him. They are the custodians of Mecca and Medina. Allah gave them that. And he's condemning them as the enemies of Islam?

Then there's the terrorism and the fighting. Islam says to only fight those who trespass. Those are not innocent civilians, What MOA has done is haram; outlawed.

You already know how arrogant he is. He loves being worshipped and he's destroying people's self-esteems by making them worship him. These kids mess up in following his teachings and hate themselves. He once insulted a member of the jamaat who visited him in Pakistan for being fat! Look at him! He's a fatass himself! He's delusional!

Yeah, Jamaat ul-Fuqra means "Community of the Impoverished." Impoverished because of him. He ain't impoverished. He lives like a fucking king. He's got this big house that people have talked about who came back from seeing him. He goes around like he's this pious Islamic leader. And his followers know he's rich and they don't even care. They think he's so great that he deserves all that money and that lifestyle.
