Discontent and loneliness have created feelings in some of us that are almost unbearable! These feelings weigh on us heavily.

When observing the children, we notice that they like what we like, dislike what we dislike. They are mirrors of what we hold important. They lack what we lack. Only ALLAH's mercy will lift us. Only our sincere faith will gain us that mercy.

Islam is such a beautiful way of life. But its beauty is overshadowed by us. We cover our beauty; noone else does. We are responsible for letting the beauty show. This is one of our goals in the "Islamic Classroom". Our theme is "Let your Islamic Beauty Show". That there is nothing more valuable than our beliefs. That Islam is more attractive and appealing than any other way of life, with much, much more to offer. We make a big thing of Islam in our classroom. Islam's the greatest thing on earth. It means smiles and laughter, freedom and pride. We teach the children that hardships are expected but that the ability to find perserverence of those hardships is pure mercy.
