On January 31, 1990, at approximately 0542 hours, I responded to 739 E. 6th Street, reference a report of a shooting at that location. At the scene Officer Murray and myself entered the building at that address via the east door, which was ajar. This entrance led into the kitchen area of the building.

In the kitchen I observed a white male and white female standing by the sink crying. On the floor in the southwest corner of the kitchen, by the refrigerator, was a white male subject laying on his back with his head against the refrigerator. He was in a pool of blood and there were bloody handprints on the wall and the refrigerator. I observed the muzzle of a blue steel, small caliber, semi-automatic pistol protruding from underneath the subject. Also lying on the floor next to the subject was a set of keys. The subject was wearing a jacket which had numerous cuts in it, similar to stab wounds. I checked the subjects pulse and was unable to find a pulse. The body was cold and stiff.

In the kitchen area I detected a strong odor similar to some type of solvent such as paint thinner or acetone, however, I did not observe any containers for such solvents in the area.

Officer Murray took the two subjects who were found in the kitchen outside. At the direction of Sgt. Rau I checked the rest of the building for any suspects or witnesses with negative results. I checked each room and closet in the building with the exception of a room, adjacent to the body, which was locked.

The scene was secured and Homicide detectives were notified. I secured the east door to the building until I was relieved by Officer Pipes.
