No one was arrested in the 1984 Denver bombing, said Denver fire Lt. Joe Sarconi, adding that there is a three-year statute of limitations for arson arrests,

"A couple of the rooms were burnt clear to the brick wall," said Anuttama Dasa, president of the Krishna's Denver congregation. "Those rooms were just behind our altar, so that was part of the spiritual sanctuary of the build-

Damage was so extensive that the congregation had to move its religious artifacts out of the temple and conduct religious services in a nearby house.

Dasa said fire investigators told him years ago they suspected FUQRA members. "But I hadn't heard anything for years until I saw the articles in the newspaper last week," he said.

At about the same time as the Denver attack, two bombs exploded in a the Philadelphia temple and caused extensive damage.

Authorities are also investigating a possible link between FUQRA and the 1990 stabbing death of Imam Rashad Khalifa, the spiritual leader of a Tucson mosque.

Nine days ago, 60 police officers from a dozen agencies raided the 101-acre FUQRA compound 12 miles east of Buena Vista.

Arrested last week were Edward McGhee, 37, of Colorado Springs; James Williams, 39, of Buena Vista; James Upshur, 47, and Vincente Rafael Pierre, 35, who face extradition proceedings in Pennsylvania.

A fifth suspect indicted in the case, Chris Childs, is at large.

Between June 1989 and March 1991, Chaffee County sheriff's deputies spied on the compound, the affidavit said.

The deputies "observed various individuals conducting martial arts training, engaging in hand-to-hand combat and other paramilitary tactical maneuvers, and practicing the shooting of assorted firearms and weaponry.'

Maps found in the Colorado Springs storage locker show mine shafts and tunnels at the compound that would "make a morethan-adequate storage facility for documents," according to the court documents.

Sect suspected in crimes across U.S.

Toronto also is among cities where cops say FUQRA has been tied to terrorist violence

The Islamic extremist group FUQRA is suspected in criminal activity in several major cities in North America, ranging from murder to arson and illegal weapons violations.

Police sources told the Rocky Mountain News Saturday that the sect's ringleader is headquartered in California and that the group may be linked to crimes in three cities in Colorado, as well as Philadelphia, Baltimore, Tucson, Brooklyn, Portland, Ore., and Toronto.

It is not known whether these activities are the works of a few or many FUQRA members. But one expert said the group probably is relatively small.

Meanwhile, officials of the Colorado Attorney General's office have beefed up security at their Denver headquarters in the wake of a raid on a FUQRA compound in Buena Vista.

An armed guard is posted at the door of the attorney general's office on Sherman Street. Officials declined to elaborate on other security measures.

"We're being extremely cautious these days because of some allegations and some rumors," said Ray Slaughter, chief deputy attorney general. "A lot of what we do has a potentially dangerous impact."

Slaughter said the attorney general intensified security on Oct. 8, when 60 police from a dozen jurisdictions raided FUQRA's remote mountain compound in Buena Vista. Simultaneous raids were carried out in Colorado Springs and four men arrested on fraud said the members were Black charges — two in each location. A fifth, Chris Childs, is still at large.

One of the arrested, James D. Williams, is believed to be FUQ-RA's Colorado ringleader.

The Islamic extremist group accused of bombing Hare Krishna temples in Denver and Philadelphia also had planned to bomb a temple in Los Angeles, Krishna leaders say.

Emil Beca, president of the Los Angeles Krishna community, said FBI agents from Denver visited him three years ago, after authorities raided a Colorado Springs storage locker belonging to members of the extremist Islamic group FUQRA.

"They said they'd found a map of the (Los Angeles) temple in the storage locker and notes that specified that the temple was very easily infiltrated because the temple devotees were so nice." Beca said.

Anuttama Dasa, a Krishna leader in Denver, said police also told him that FUQRA members have targeted Jews for violence.

Beca said FUQRA members, who are believed to be Black Muslims, hate Hare Krishnas because the Krishna religion is affiliated with the Hindu religion. Hindus and Muslims have a long history of conflict.

Meanwhile, investigators are sifting evidence from their Oct. 8 raid of FUQRA's 101-acre com- and four women, believed to be the pound near Buena Vista.

Police found 30 assault weapons stashed in two hillside mine tunnels on the old mining camp site.

U.S. funds research on wolves

Study targets feasibility of predator in Rockies

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service received a congressional directive Friday to spend as much as \$50,000 working with private groups to see if it's feasible to return wolves to the Rocky Mountain area.

"Because the wording of the directive doesn't specifically say Colorado, we'll need some clarifi-cation — although we're fairly certain that is the intent," said Larry Shanks, Fish and Wildlife Service endangered-species coordinator at the regional office in Lakewood.

The money, appropriated through the "interior and related agencies appropriations bill," was requested by Rep. David Skaggs, D-Colo., who became interested

after petitions from wolf-advocate groups urging such a study.

One group, Sinapu, approached the Fish and Wildlife Service a year ago asking for a study but was told because Colorado wasn't included in the recovery plan, such a study couldn't be funded.

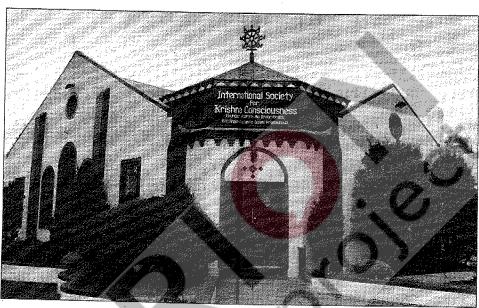

Hare Krishnas fear targeting

Members of Hare Krishna temples in Denver and Phil-adelphia have known firsthand the work of an invisible enemy that attacks without warning, aiming to inflict injury, damage and death.

The specter has frightened the congregations of the Hare Krishna faith, a 5,000-year-old branch of Hinduism.

In Denver, a firebomb was thrown through the back of the Hare Krishna temple at 1400 Cherry St. in 1984. The blaze destroyed much of the sanctuary and did \$150,000 damage to the building and its contents.

This was not like most ter rorist groups, where they will say, 'We did it; hooray for us; we're gonna wipe out every-body for our cause,' " said Den-Dasa. "It was very secret. There were no letters or phone calls or anything like that."

In Philadelphia, about the same time, two bombs went off in the group's temple.

in the group's temple. One was designed as a diversion to panic people toward the other door. Two minutes later, a huge bomb exploded at the other door, where the panic-stricken congregation was supposed to

Fortunately, our services had started later, so only a few people were in the temple when

the bombs went off, and only one woman was injured, cut by some glass from a window that blew out," said Saudamani Dasi, a member of the Phil-

adelphia congregation.
"But a whole basement section was burned out and blasted away. It was a really, really heavy-duty bomb," she said.

As in the Denver firebomb-As in the Denver Inferomo-ing, there were no arrests. But federal investigators have sus-pected the Islamic fundamental-ist sect called FUQRA of waging covert terrorist warfare on Hare Krishnas and other Hindu

Last week, Colorado Attorney General Gale Norton said five men charged with defrauding the state workers' compensation fund of \$355,000 may be members of FUQRA. Affidavits for warrants to search houses in Colorado Springs and a 101-acre compound at Buena Vista stated that FUQRA may be

Dasa said the bombings were especially disturbing to the Hare Krishnas because the attackers remained invisible.

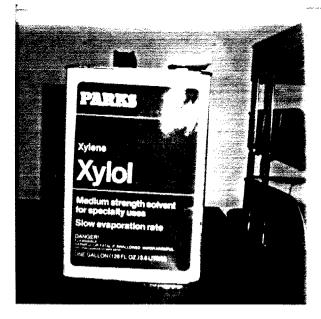

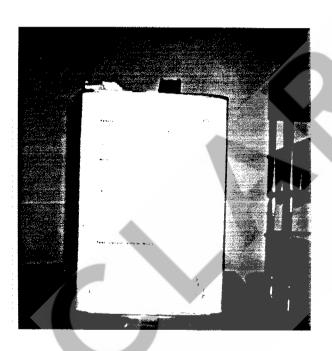

On December 14, David James OLIYNYK, DOB: September 16, 1950, address in Surrey, British Columbia, and William Edwin JAMES II, DOB: June 15, 1951, address in Bellingham, Washington, were arrested by United States Customs Service and Drug Enforcement Administration Special Agents following their attempt to purchase fifteen kilograms of cocaine from undercover agents in Seattle, Washington.

Approximately \$230,000 U.S. currency was seized from the pair. The cocaine was to be distributed in British Columbia, Canada.

OLIYNYK is the Secretary/-Treasurer of the White Rock, British Columbia chapter of the Hells Angels Motorcycle Club. JAMES is the Secretary/Treasurer of the Bellingham, Washington chapter of the Bandidos Motorcycle Club. This is the first documented instance of members of these two major outlaw biker gangs uniting to distribute drugs, as well as the first reported instance of their being involved in a joint venture to acquire cocaine in the United States for distribution in Canada.

The overall investigation into the activities of the two clubs is an international effort involving the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, as well as several United States Federal and local law enforcement agencies.

Black Muslims

In January 1990, the Los Angeles Police Department had an altercation with several Black Muslims. This incident left three Muslims and four L.A.P.D. officers injured. Shortly after this incident, two L.A. County Sheriff's Deputies were attacked by two Black Muslims during a routine traffic stop. One of the deputy's guns was taken away from him, and was then aimed at the deputy; the Muslim was fatally wounded by the other deputy. The other Muslim was also shot and wounded, but later recovered.

On 04/30/90 a shooting occurred in between California. the San Victorville. Bernardino Sheriff's Office and a Black Muslim. The incident occurred at a local bank sheriff's deputies Victorville. when approached an individual to question him reference stolen checks he was suspected of cashing. The subject began to fight with the deputies and ran out of the bank with the deputies in pursuit.

The deputies apprehended the subject across the street from the bank. He again fought with them and broke away, running down the street. The subject stopped and was observed to pull a pistol and shot at the deputies. One of the deputies was wounded and fell to the sidewalk. The subject ran up to the

counded deputy and started shooting at him at coint blank range as he lay on the sidewalk. The deputy rolled around and the subject never to a good shot, however, he was wounded four times in his lower extremities. The other deputies returned fire, fatally wounding the subject.

The subject was identified as Halim Abdul Karim, true name of George Phillips. Karim had several aliases, for which he had valid California identification. Karim's vehicle was located in the rear parking lot of the bank. A search of the vehicle revealed a 9mm and a 44 magnum pistol. Karim also used a 9mm pistol in the shooting.

The Black Muslims are followers of Minister Louis Farrakhan, leader of the Nation of Islam. Their main headquarters is in Chicago, Illinois.

Farrakhan, however, does have a residence listed in South Phoenix. The membership to the Black Muslims, Nation of Islam, is unknown (it is listed to be 10,000 members nationwide). Farrakhan makes periodic speaking engagements in the Phoenix area.

Farrakhan has his own security known as the "Fruits of Islam", which consist of both men and women. The Fruits of Islam are trained in the Martial Arts and weapons and are strictly disciplined. The men are clean shaven, close cropped hair, dressed in dark suits, white shirts and bow ties.

Muslims have strong beliefs that they are victims of white supremacy and racism. It is apparent from the violent incidents in California that they are resisting police authority and are capable of doing bodily harm. Some Muslim members have served time in prisons throughout the country for various crimes such as murder, narcotic trafficking, etc. These people, according to the Farrakhan, are now reformed.

There are a few Black Muslims in Arizona, but exact numbers are unknown. There have been no reports of violent incidents between the police and Black Muslims in Arizona, however, due to their unpredictable nature, it is advised that officers exercise extreme caution in dealing with them.

Biker's intimidation may compromise officer

Intimidation is one of the biker's most powerful weapons. As a testament to the belief that intimidation will keep gang members from falling "victim" to the criminal justice system, they continue their string of assaults on citizens throughout Arizona.

Victims of Dirty Dozen assaults will not testify against their assaulters for fear of reprisals from gang members. Generally there are 3 to 6 gang members involved in beatings which usually take place at various bars and involve various types of weapons.

Gang members have now extended their intimidation to include police officers. This is being done through the use of the biker's version of a Field Interview card. Information on the card includes the date and time, the officers name, badge number and type of vehicle. In addition, the type of treatment received by the officer may be included.

Recently, a Mesa Police officer found himself involved in this type of situation. Not only was the officer FI'd and threatened with a lawsuit, but the Dirty Dozen member was very abusive.

It is recommended that when dealing with the Dirty Dozen members, or any other gang members, be firm but fair. Caution should be used to avoid compromising one's better judgement.

THE NUMBER ONE ENEMY OF GOD'S MIRACLE:

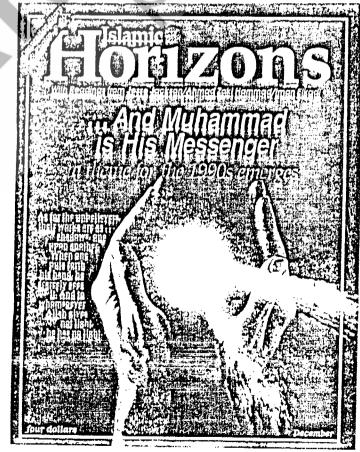
CANCELS THE FIRST PILLAR OF ISLAM

The first pillar of Islam is clearly stated in the Quran, which came to us through Muhammad's mouth. (Some Muslims forget this fact.) Verse 18 of sura 3 informs us that the first pillar of Islam, i.e., Shahaadah is "LAA ELAAHA ELLA ALLAH." Furthermore, our Almighty Creator, after adding special

emphasis to this most important pillar, proclaims that this is the *Shahaadah* as proclaimed by "God, the angels, and those who possess knowledge."

INTRODUCTION

It all began a few billion years ago when an angel named Satan developed supercilious thoughts that he could be a god besides God.

This challenge to God's absolute authority was not only blasphemous; it was simply impossible. The truth is that only God possesses the power to be a god. Satan simply did not possess the necessary power or qualifications to take care of a dominion, as a god, and run it efficiently without chaos, disease, misery, and accidents.

Open Letter to Disbelievers:

Are You Filssing the Boat?

I can show you tood irrefutable proofs that I am God's Messenger of the Covenant (3:81). Can you show me one, just one, proof that I am not? Do you know why you do not believe the Quran? The Quran tells us exactly why you do not believe.

Let me cite the Quranic prophecy in 3:81 according to the famous translation of Pickthall, not my translation:

When Allah made (His) covenant with the Prophets. (He said): Behold that which I have given you of the Scripture and knowledge. And afterward there will come unto you a messenger, confirming that which ve possess. Ye shall believe in him and ve shall help him. He said: Do ve agree, and will ye take up My burden (which I lay upon you) in this (matter)? They answered: We agree. He said: Then bear witness. I will be a witness with you.

The Quran is "Clear, without any ambiguity" (18:1, 3 1:28), and this verse informs us that after all the prophets have come to this world and have delivered all the scriptures, a consolidating messenger will come to unify and purify the scriptures.

Who is this Messenger?

For this computer age, the name of God's Messenger of the Covenant is mathematically coded into the Quran. I can show you 1000 physical, verifiable, and utterly irrefutable proofs

that I, Rashad Khalifa, am God's messenger who is prophesied in 3:81.

The Most Important Event

Now that the truth has been proven to you on the pages of this Bulletin, do you have enough strength to overcome your ego?

[Book of Malachi 3:1-3]

Do you know why you continue to defy God's truth? The Quran tells us exactly why you do not believe. You worship some other god besides God. That's the reason. Verse 25:43 informs us of people whose god is their ego. Accordingly, if you:

- [1] see the clear Quranic truth,
- [2] supported by overwhelming proofs,
- [3] your mullas and shaikhs cannotcome up with a single argument squirm this truth, and
- [4] you still refuse to accept God's truth, then face it—you have another god besides Allah.

This is confirmed by the verses immediately after 3:81, where God's messenger is prophesied; they emphasize that anyone who fails to accept this Quranic truth is dismissed from the religion of Islam. Please read 3:81-91 very carefully; these verses are, as always, very clear & may save you.

How to Distinguish True Messengers

God's true messengers (1) have solid proof from God that they are His messengers, (2) advocate worshiping God ALONE, & upholding the word of God ALONE, and (3) never ask for a wage.

Satan has flooded the world with false messengers, his aim is to drown the truth in an ocean of falsehood, to divert the people from God's messenger and thus prevent them from being saved. However, God has given us the mind and the absolute freedom to choose His kingdom or Satan's.

If anyone claims to be God's messenger, and fails to meet the criteria listed above, he is a false messenger.

Additionally, God's messenger is supported by God's invisible soldiers, God's treasury, and God's guidance for His sincere believers. See 15:95-97.

God's Messenger of the Covenant: Why?

The Quran, God's Final Testament, consolidates the messages delivered by all of God's prophets into one global message. This is the main mission of God's Messenger of the Covenant.

Islam is the only religion approved by God. [3:19]

Anyone who accepts other than Islam as a religion, it will not be accepted from him; he will be a loser in the Hereafter. [3:85]

All religions—Islam, Christianity, Judaism, Hinduism—have been corrupted through idolization of their prophets and saints.

Judaism

Judging from the writings of a famous Rabbi, Harold Kushner, many of today's Jews do not believe in the Hereafter, an essential requirement for salvation (2:62, 5:69), and do not believe in God's omnipotence. Failing to recognize God's qualities is not knowing God. See Kushner's book WHEN BAD THINGS HAPPEN TO GOOD PEOPLE, Avon Books, 1981.

Christianity

If Jesus came back to this world, the Christians would crucify him. Outstanding Christian scholars have now recognized that today's Christianity has nothing to do with Jesus' religion (see THE MYTH OF GOD INCARNATE, The Westminster Press, Philadelphia, 1977). The original Christian doctrine was mortally corrupted during the Nicene Conferences (325 AD).

Islam

If Muhammad came back to this world, the Muslims would stone him to death. For today's Islam has nothing to do with the religion preached by Abraham and Muhammad. Today's Islam is an anti-Quran Satanic cult.

Everything today's Muslims do is

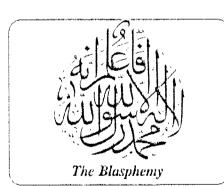
