And when you say that, did he ever have discussions with you about that? (Unknown noise in background) Well we always discussed it. We always talked about, uh, the, the so called Islamic scholars and, uh, and then you know about Hadif (ph) there. So I could read the Hadif (ph) and I could see how ridiculous some of it was compared to the Quran (ph). See if, if the, the Hadif (ph) is not supported by Quran (ph) it's not supposed to be taught. And, uh, there's a lot of Muslims out there that are antagonistic toward people who teach. The Muslims here are antagonistic toward me because I'm promote what brother KHALIF teach.
