NARRATIVE	CRIME SCENE SYNOPSIS
I. <u>Physical Evidence and Known Conditions.</u> -	
A. <u>Pramod Gadre</u> -	
Mr. Gadre was discovered deceased at the steering wheel of his vehicle approximately five blocks west of his residence. He had been shot three times; one projectile entered the left side of the neck and proceeded at a downward angle eventually lodging under the right armpit, while the other two projectiles entered the right side of the head and passed through on

	an approximate level plain. One of these projectiles was located at the left edge of the front seat; the other is presumed to have exited through the open drivers' door window. One expended .9mm casing was found within the vehicle and one was found on the street. Both of the expended casings were marked "Browning .9mm Luger".
	The projectile which lodged within the victim was recovered during autopsy and determined to be a .38 Special/.357 Magnum hollow point bullet of Remington-Peters manufacture.
	An ejected magazine from a semi-automatic pistol was discovered in the street near the Gadre vehicle. The magazine contained 11 cartridges each marked "Browning .9mm Luger."
	B. Indira Gadre -
	The body of Mrs. Gadre was discovered in the living room of the residence approximately five feet inside the front door.
	A live "Browning .9mm Luger" cartridge was discovered on the living room floor approximately six feet from the front door. Additionally, two expended "F.C. .9mm Luger" casings were recovered from the living room area.
	Mrs. Gadre was shot twice in the head, both projectiles passing through. The projectiles were recovered from locations within the residence indicating that she was shot once while standing and once again after falling to the floor.
	C. Leela Nevaskar -
	The body of Mrs. Nevaskar was discovered in a dining room area. Three expended F.C. .9mm Luger" casings were discovered in the dining area. Recovered or located projectiles indicated that Mrs. Nevaskar was seated or in the process of standing when the first shot was fired and was shot again in the head after she had fallen to the floor.
	D. Condition of the Residence -
	1. There was no ransacking apparent in any of the rooms of the residence.
	2. The vehicle entry garage door was in the open position.
	3. The peephole in the front door of the residence was in such poor condition that the optics are insufficient to allow anyone from within the residence to view the exterior with any clarity to determine the identity of anyone who might be standing outside.
	II. Relevant Background Information -
	A. The Gadres left the Peacock Restaurant shortly before 2100 hours on the night of August 1, 1984.
	B. Information received has indicated that it was the normal habits of Mr. and Mrs. Gadre not to leave the residence during the evening once they had returned home from work.
	C. Mrs. Gadre and Mrs. Nevaskar were dressed in nightgowns or night clothing. Mr. Gadre was dressed in street clothing.

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	D. Information obtained has indicated that it was Mr. Gadre's routine to place his wallet and wristwatch on the television set upon returning home and retiring for the evening.
	E. Sheila Gadre had advised that the remote control device for the garage door opener was faulty and that her father would often have to manipulate it to some extent to get the garage door to close after he had driven out.
	III. <u>Analysis</u> -
	A. <u>Sequence of Death</u> -
	The shot fired from the .38/.357 has been intentionally omitted from this analysis and will be addressed at the conclusion of this section.
	It would appear that Mr. Gadre was killed in his vehicle prior to the death of the two females within the residence.
	The ejected magazine found in the street is from a Smith & Wesson, Model 59 or 459, .9mm semi-automatic pistol and has a 14 round capacity. The following scenario assumes that a fully loaded magazine containing "Browning .9mm Lugar" ammunition was placed in an empty chambered weapon.
	1. <u>Hypothesis</u> -
	a. One round is chambered in the weapon, leaving 13 rounds in the magazine.
	b. Mr. Gadre is shot once, the recoil action of the weapon ejecting a spent casing and placing a live round in the chamber leaving 12 rounds in the magazine.
	c. Mr. Gadre is shot a second time, the recoil action of the weapon ejecting a spent casing and placing a live round in the chamber, leaving 11 rounds in the magazine. (Due to the trajectory, these shots are believed to have been fired by a person sitting in a passenger seat of the vehicle.)
	d. For reasons unknown, the magazine containing 11 live rounds is ejected, falling to the street, and is later recovered.
	e. A second magazine loaded with "F.C. .9mm Lugar" ammunition is inserted in the weapon.
	f. The suspects travel to the Gadre residence and enter the living room where, for reasons undetermined, the remaining live "Browning .9mm Lugar" round is ejected unfired and in so doing the first "F.C. .9mm Lugar" round from the new magazine is chambered.
	g. Five "F.C. Lugar .9mm" rounds are fired and the spent casings ejected within the Gadre residence, killing Mrs. Gadre and Mrs. Nevaskar.

The direction of travel of this projectile would suggest that the person firing it was standing outside the Gadre vehicle and fired at a downward angle through the open driver's door window.

IV. Unresolved Issues -

A. Mr. Gadre's Absence From Residence -

The fact that Mr. Gadre had his wallet in his pants pocket could suggest that he had departed the residence casually. If this is correct, a number of hypotheses, not limited to the following, could be developed.

1. Mr. Gadre left the residence with an individual without alarm for his safety, followed by a confrontation upon entering the Gadre vehicle. Mr. Gadre is killed, after which the assailant(s) returned to the residence for the purpose of eliminating the female witnesses. The open garage door would suggest that the threatening encounter began shortly after leaving the residence and entering the vehicle.
2. Mr. Gadre was accosted by persons unknown as he drove into the driveway of the residence and opened the garage door in preparation to secure the vehicle for the evening.
3. Mr. Gadre was accosted by persons unknown as he was preparing to leave the residence in his vehicle.

B. Motive -

To date, investigative efforts have failed to reveal the motive precipitating the death of the three victims. This aspect of the investigation is the primary focus of the ongoing effort and will include a detailed financial analysis of the victim's personal and business dealings. Additionally, telephone toll information has been subpoenaed from the general security manager for Pacific Northwest Bell.

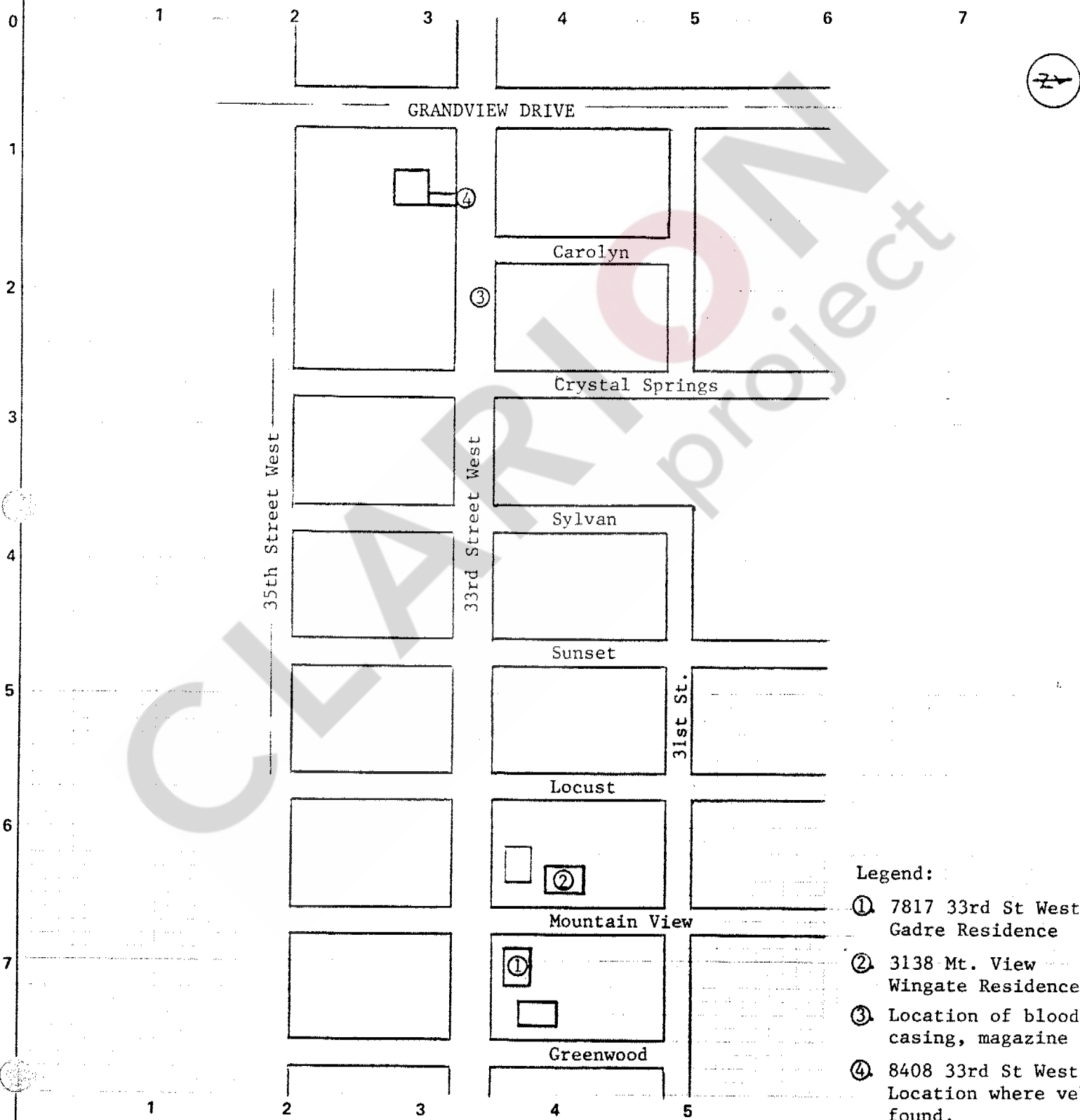

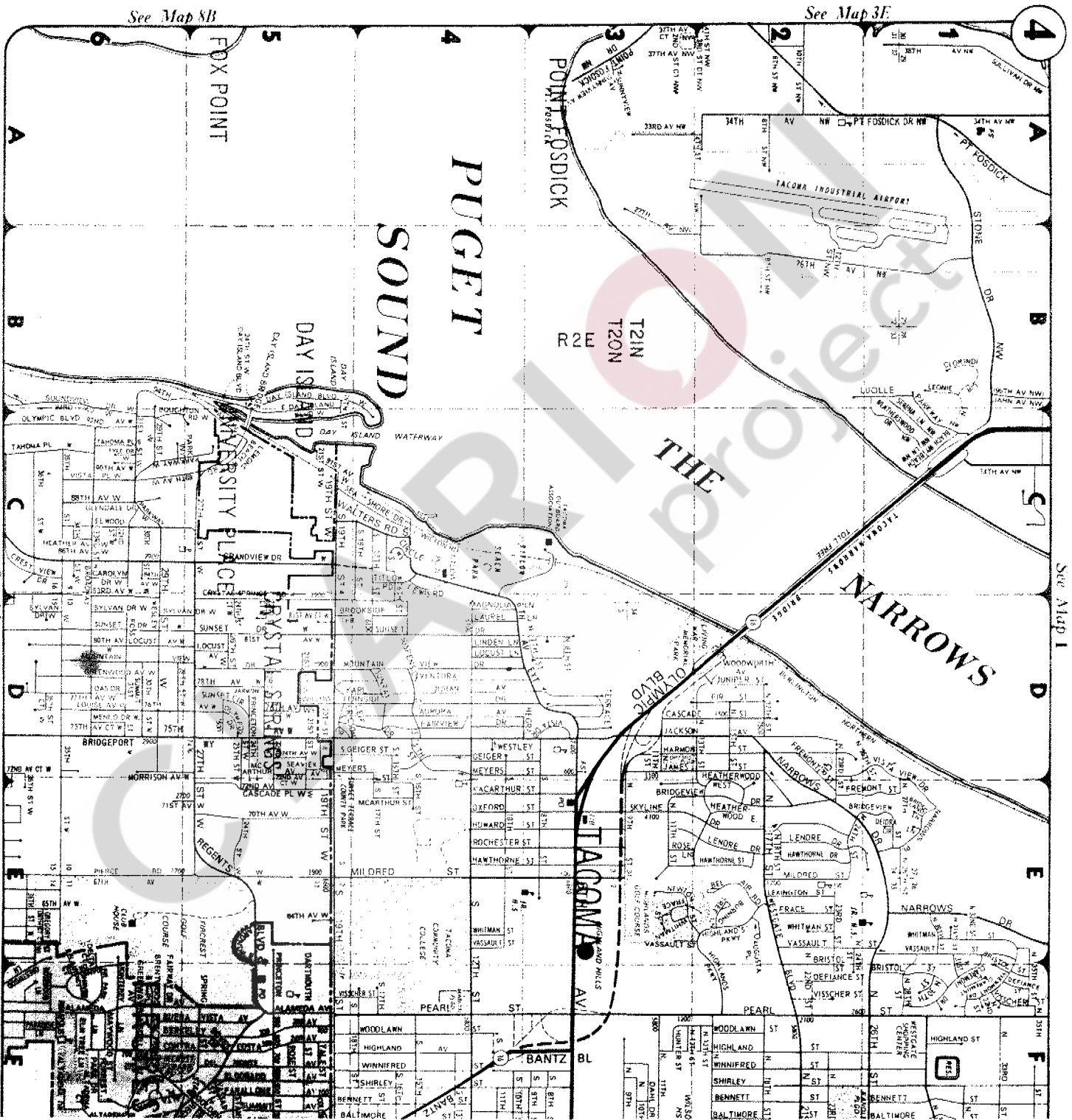

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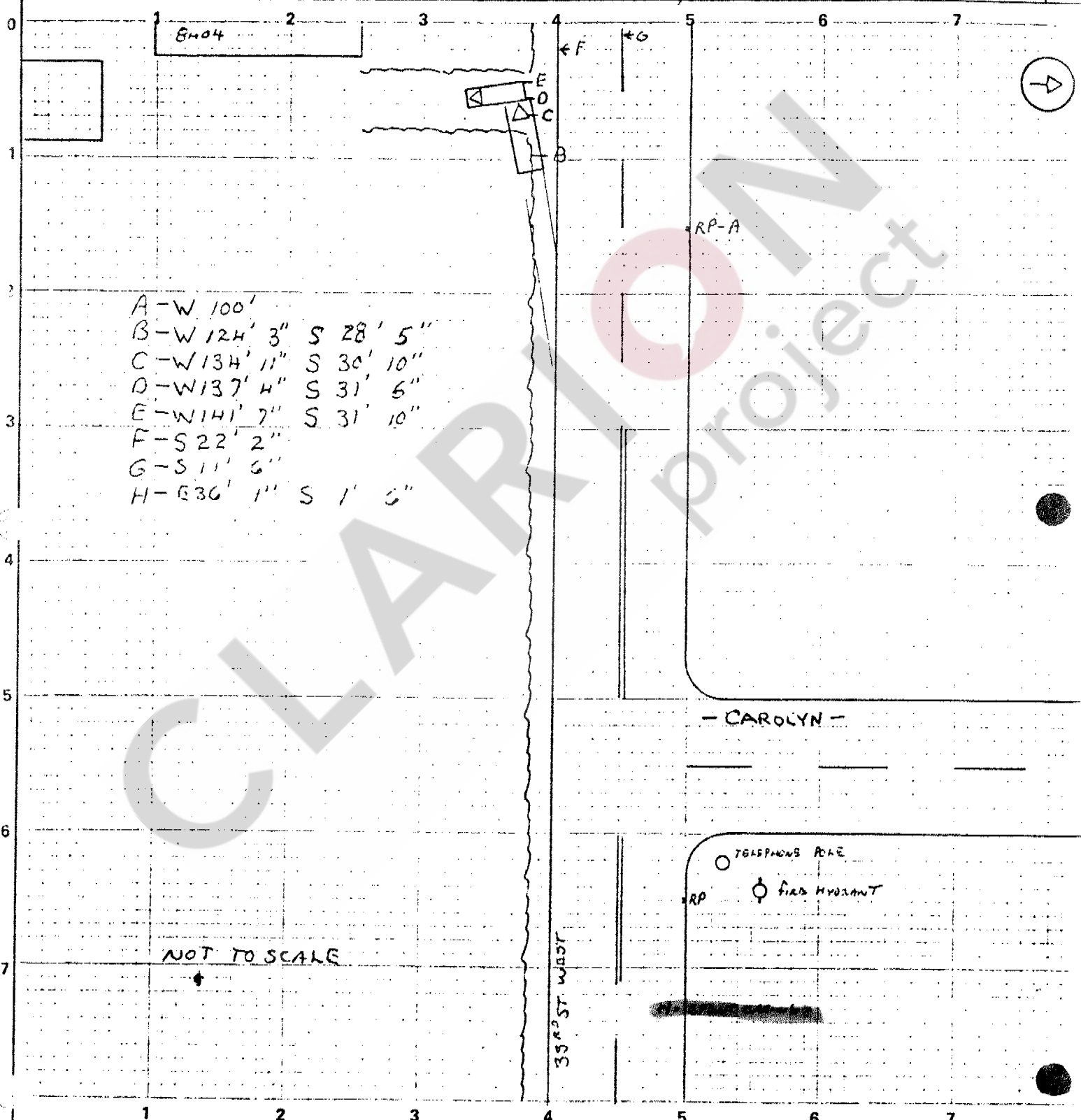

I received for examination the following items:

- Q1. One spent bullet from the body of victim Pramod Gadre.
- Q2. One spent bullet from the vehicle of victim Pramod Gadre.
- Q3. One spent bullet from the residence wall.
- Q4. One spent bullet from the residence floor.
- Q5. One spent cartridge case from the street.
- Q6. One spent cartridge case from the victim's vehicle.
- Q7. One live cartridge from the residence floor.
- Q8. One spent cartridge case from the living room.
- Q9. One spent cartridge case from the living room.
- Q10. One spent cartridge case from the dining room.
- Q11. One spent cartridge case from the dining room.
- Q12. One spent cartridge case from the dining room.
1. One magazine and eleven live cartridges.

RESULTS OF EXAMINATION

Q1 is a spent caliber .38 Special/.357 Magnum hollow point bullet of Remington-Peters manufacture. It is most probably of the 125 grain weight. This bullet exhibits 8 lands and grooves with a right twist and could have been fired by one of the revolvers listed in Table 1.

Q2, Q3, and Q4 are all spent caliber 9mm full metal case bullets. All three of these bullets exhibit 6 lands and grooves and could have been fired by one of the semiautomatic pistols listed in Table 2. Q2, Q3, and Q4 were all fired from the same gun.

Q5 and Q6 are both spent caliber 9mm cartridge cases headstamped "BROWNING 9MM LUGER". Both Q5 and Q6 were determined to have been fired in the same gun.

Q8, Q9, Q10, Q11, and Q12 are all spent caliber 9mm cartridge cases headstamped "FC 9MM LUGER" (Federal Cartridge Corporation). All five of these cartridge cases were determined to have been fired in the same gun, which is the same gun that fired Q5 and Q6.

The gun that fired Q5, Q6, Q8, Q9, Q10, Q11, and Q12 is most likely a recoil operated semiautomatic pistol with a J. M. Browning locked breech/tipping barrel type of design. Item 1 consists of a Smith & Wesson 14-round 9mm magazine. This maga-

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zine appears well worn and may have been in service for several years. A pistol that fits the rifling measurements of the Q2, Q3, and Q4 bullets, and incorporates design features that could produce markings like those observed on the Q5, Q6, Q8, Q9, Q10, Q11, and Q12 cartridge cases, and will house the Smith & Wesson magazine in Item 1 is a 9mm semiautomatic pistol manufactured by Smith & Wesson in Models 59, 459, and 559. The Model 59 was introduced about 1970, the Model 459 about 1980, and the Model 559 about 1981.

Item 1 also contains eleven live caliber 9mm Luger cartridges headstamped "BROWNING 9MM LUGER"; Q7 is a cartridge of the same headstamp and is consistent with the cartridges in Item 1 and with the spent cases in Q5 and Q6. There are no markings on Q7 that would indicate why it would have been ejected unfired.
